



The <u>Southwest Fire Science Consortium</u> (SWFSC) and the <u>Arizona Wildfire Initiative</u> (AZWI) at Northern Arizona University's School of Forestry (NAU) seek to hire one Americorps VISTA members to support science communication, public outreach, and public education on the topic of wildland fire.

Job duties:

- The VISTA member will promote the <u>Fire Ecology Learning Lab</u>. They will connect teachers with lecturers and assist with hands on learning.
- The VISTA member will expand upon the communication of emerging fire science with NM and AZ fire and natural resource staff, including municipalities, states, federal agencies, and tribes.
- The VISTA member will table events to promote SWFSC and AZWI products, network, and solicit ideas for ways to support our constituency.

Details: You must live in Arizona and have an interest in wildland fire. The job will begin January 2024, is a 32-hour work week, and will last 1 year. This is <u>not</u> a great opportunity for students since it requires 32 hours a week. We are looking for people with curiosity, a desire to learn and work in a high-paced team environment, and the ability to work independently with guidance from a mentor.

Benefits & Compensation: Members will receive a living stipend, rent stipend, on-the-job training and experience and access to the Americorps network, student loan deferment, sick and vacation time, and non-competitive eligibility for federal employment. Those who complete their term will also receive an education award equal to the Pell Grant. <u>Find out more here</u>.
